Changes are the only way to Everlastingness



My dear Rotarians, I suppose you and your clubs, committee members are getting busy preparing for service projects as August approaches. August is the month for Membership strengthening, Rotary Extension and Club Formation. Our district used to have 91 clubs in Japan and 9 clubs overseas. To our regret, Chiyoda Group lost one club, RC Tokyo

Rainbow, on 30th June, 2017 and we are left with only 99 clubs in the district. When a district has over 100 clubs, it is advisable to divide the district. Rotary extension is not a main topic for our district goal, however we have rooms for club formation. It might be a bit too controversial at this moment but we will for sure leave it a big subject for discussions from now on.

Membership strengthening is an important subject for our district activities. Member strengthening committee chairperson, Takashi Tanaka and Membership retention committee chairperson, Sumio Yoshida, have prepared several seminars for membership strengthening, and information exchange and other tactics for potential members. We have 10 clubs in Japan and 4 clubs overseas that have fewer than 20 members. All these clubs are very cooperative to the district concerning Youth Exchange and Yoneyama Foundation activities. There are clubs however small that do excellent service projects. Because of the goal in Rotary for membership extension, the 2016 Council of Legislation passed the act to accept Rotaract members as Rotarians and also easier entrance for women. Our district tactic committee has plans and expects in three years that at least 20% of members are women. Each club should modify to a certain extent their traditions and characteristics to match this new needs. The title, "Changes are the only way to everlastingness", is a motto of Tenshin Okakura, who influenced Japanese Modern Arts by introducing traditional arts to the world. In order to have Rotary survive for another 100 years, we need to change.

RI President Ian Riseley suggested, in order to carry out long term continuous service projects, at least one member of each club to plant a tree until the Earth Day, 22nd April next year. We, Rotarians, have been digging deep wells and putting up buildings as our service projects. But we have not been able to train personnels to maintain these projects and to keep wells and buildings. Continuous service projects means that, after direct involvement of Rotarians has finished, the positive affects of these projects should be prolonged with good effect. 1.2 million trees to be planted should benefit the global environment and so this project should be planned by each and every Rotary Club as a new sustainable service.

The 2020 Olympics and Paralympics will focus on continuity on their management and the Olympic charter shows consideration for "Sports", "Culture", and "Environment". It has been said that Tokyo is full of greens and parks. I understand it but I again suggest you can work together with overseas fellowship clubs and sister clubs to perform this project as one of memorial projects of your clubs. If understanding and cooperation could be achieved I hope the 4900 trees will be planted on our planet.
