## Governor's message

## Service aimed at youth will be the power that drives the world forward.



As we welcome the brilliant fresh green of the spring season, we simultaneously mark two months remaining until the close of the 2021-22 year. It pleases me greatly that so many clubs were able to hold anniversary celebrations. I would like to offer those clubs my sincerest congratulations.

Our District Conferences in Japan have been concentrated in this time of year due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic. I have been making my way around the country with the intention of attending as many of those conferences as I can. Being no exception, the holding date for our conference in District 2750 was changed from February to May 12-13. I implore you all to attend.

May is "Youth Service Month." Youth service activities conducted by Rotary have a history of over one century, and have been continued by many Rotarians with considerable passion. Over that time, alongside the implementation of a large number of programs, Rotary has been recognized as a "youth service organization" the likes of which the world has never seen. In Japan, the venerable Umekichi Yoneyama's fiercely passionate spirit of help gave birth to the Rotary Yoneyama Memorial Foundation, which numerous non-Japanese international students have benefited from over time. Furthermore, in the 1960s, the Interact Club and Rotaract Club were born, followed by the adoption of RYLA (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards), which continue today. This year, we will be able to take in four youth exchange students as well as dispatch four of them. This will spark a brightly-shining light of hope for the future. The members of the Youth Exchange Committee have my sincerest thanks for their efforts.

In pursuing Rotary activities, we offer a helping hand to poverty-stricken people who need food and water and disease-afflicted individuals while concurrently implementing development programs for the youth who will uphold our future world. Those activities serve to create connections that form guideposts leading from the present to the future. I believe that this is the substantial mission that the world has assigned to us as Rotarians, and I intend to fulfill that mission alongside you all.

Today, the world is in the midst of battling mankind's new enemy: COVID-19. Even so, a new threat has emerged in which cities are being destroyed and people are killing one another. That threat, of course, is the Russian invasion of the Ukraine. Many Ukrainians have been slaughtered, and over four million of them have been forced to leave their home country behind as refugees and relocate to neighboring nations or other European countries. Some of them, albeit small in number, have fled to Japan. Why, even in the 21st century, do people keep insisting on engaging in pointless conflict? We must bring an end to this situation as soon as humanly possible and engage in the development of youth with a future through the reconstruction of the Ukraine and its cities. While numerous Rotarians in neighboring countries are continuing their relief efforts, the funds needed to do so are considerable. The same goes for reconstruction efforts as well. I ask my fellow Rotarians to donate what they can. Let us rise up now, at this crucial time, for the sake of youth around the world.
