## Governor's message

Making contributions and taking advantage of grants for the sake of the community and the world is our duty as Rotarians.

I imagine that since the start of the 2021-22 year, the members of our various Clubs have encountered considerable difficulties in engaging in various projects, holding Club Meetings, and pursuing other endeavors in the midst of the COVID-19 pandemic. The same, of course, can be said of The Official Visit. While a roundtable for the visit was held offline. the Club Meetings convened over Zoom, making it impossible for me to directly meet you face to face. For me, this was most unfortunate. Additionally, at the will of our Clubs, Club Meetings were also limited to roundtables. Numerous requests were also made for Club Meetings to convene at a later date in light of trends surrounding COVID-19. Consequently, not a day passed when the District Secretaries and District Vice Secretaries were not swamped with schedule adjustments. I am sincerely grateful to them for their efforts. I hereby report that all District Officers are working collectivity amid the COVID-19 pandemic to fulfill our responsibilities so that we may respect the wishes of Clubs and carry out our duty of visiting Club Meetings with the singular mentality that "the District stands together with its Clubs."

November is "Rotary Foundation Month." Since being established on the premise of "creating a fund to do good in the world" as advocated by Foundation father and original chair Chairman Arch C. Klumph, The Rotary Foundation has produced wonderful results on a global-reaching scale. Both making contributions to the Foundation and making use of its funds in service activities is our duty as Rotarians. For grants, the Foundation offers "Global Grants" (GG), which are put to use in international, relatively large-scale projects whose purpose is limited to Rotary's Seven Areas of Focus, and "District Grants" (DG), which help subsidize service activities oriented towards local needs within communities that Clubs

have a close relationship with. As consideration has been accorded to these grants so that Clubs can apply for them in accordance with their actual situation, my hope is that many Clubs will take advantage of them. The grants have also been used for the dispatch of The Rotary Peace Fellowship and The Rotary Foundation scholarship students, paving the way for some fantastic outcomes. Please contribute for the purpose of further promoting that outreach as we move forward.

The first of the seven presidential conferences covering the Seven Areas of Focus advocated by RI President Shekhar Mehta was held in Gyeongju, South Korea on October 5. The themes of that particular conference were "The Environment" and "Disease Prevention and Treatment." Regrettably, attendance of the conference was confined to Zoom due to the COVID-19 pandemic. District 2820 Governor Kazuo Arai made a presentation at the conference regarding the "Global Environment Support Project." On the topic of disease prevention and treatment, alongside the Governors of Districts 2570, 2630 and 2710, I presented on three pioneering GG projects by District 2750 that pertain to COVID-19: "Providing Telehealth and Communication During COVID-19 Pandemic to Underserved Populations" and "Providing Protective Gowns to Hospitals with Important Roles During COVID-19 Pandemic," both of which were conducted by the Rotary Club of Hiroo Tokyo together with The Rotary Club of Naperville (Illinois), as well as on "Rotary Italia Prevention to Defeat the COVID-19 Pandemic 4," which was conducted by District 2750.
