Governor's message

Rotary International District 2750 2021-22 Governor Shinichi Miura

"As this passionate baton changes hands"

Having espoused the theme of "SERVE TO CHANGE LIVES" for the 2021-2022 year, RI President Shekhar Mehta stated, "We will expand Rotary service as we 'grow more and do more.'" He continued by elaborating on the need to develop membership, saying, "The answer is each one, bring one – ask each Rotarian to bring one member to Rotary." In doing so, President Mehta indicated the path to Rotary's growth.

Based on this theme, we adopted "Connect with a spirit of service, from the region to the world" as our District slogan, and discussed it at Official Visits with each club in the District. Thanks to the efforts of our club members and District Officers, everyone connected their spirits through a myriad of projects even during the COVID-19 pandemic, successfully proving that clubs are the main force behind Rotary activities.

For the first time in Rotary history, the International Assembly was conducted over Zoom. We took part in this assembly late at night over an eleven-day period. Thanks to the efforts of the Officer delegation, we successfully held the Three Key Training Seminars in a physical format while maintaining sufficient distance from each other. Between last July and September, the Olympic and Paralympic Games were held in Tokyo, and the District 2020 Support Committee successfully spearheaded fullscale efforts to help out. Membership Development, Public Image, Vocational Service, the Committee Chair Yoneyama Meeting, The Rotary Foundation Seminar and other events organized by the District were held physically whenever the COVID-19 pandemic permitted it, and we benefited from considerable club member participation.

Although we have been forced to change our schedule for new member orientation countless times, we stuck to a physical format and paired it with a discussion. I feel that our new members were able to take a considerable step forward as Rotarians as a result.

For external projects, to simultaneously mark both our District's Rotary Day of Service and World Polio Day, the Public Image Committee spearheaded efforts to display hanging ads reading "END POLIO NOW" in Tokyo trains. Nearby Districts also gave their support, evoking a considerable response. Simultaneously, we held a walk rally with polio survivors between Tokyo Station and Yurakucho Station, generating awareness among people along the street and those who gathered at the plaza in front of the latter station.

With the founding of new clubs, our numbers have increased. New Rotaract clubs have also been founded, resulting in the addition of young members to our ranks and enabling us to pursue a Rotary that stands for the future. Through "Homecoming Day," which was planned and implemented by the Rotary Family Support Committee that we newly founded in 2021-22 year, past participants in various Youth Service activities fields gather together to engage in discussion, deepen their friendship, take each other's hands as members of the same Rotary family, and outline the path that they will proceed to walk down together. This project is hugely important for that reason, and we have great expectations for its further development going forward.

While it is a shame that the Pacific Basin Group could not join our District Conference, it was held over a two-day period just as it was in previous years. The large number of members who attended was surprising and pleasing.

In February, war, which Rotary despises more than anything else, broke out. Many citizens lost their lives, a nation was destroyed, and numerous people were forced to become refugees. Ukraine is also home to many Rotarians. I want us to unite our spirt and extend them a helping hand, and implore you to cooperate towards that end.

In June, the Rotary International Convention will be held in the U.S. city of Houston. Following the convention, I also intend to make an Official Visit to the Pacific Basin Group as well. This visit will mark the official event that will cap off my year as District Governor, as well as the first time in two years that I will have been able to make Official Visits to all clubs in the District. Allow me to close my final Governor's MONTHLY LETTER by expressing my deepest appreciation for mankind's ability to get the better of COVID-19 in our struggle with the virus and press on forward once more.
