## Governor's Message

February 23 is

"World Understanding and Peace Day"



Dear Rotarians and Rotaractors, how are you doing?

February 23, 1905, the date of the first meeting of Rotary's founder, Paul Harris, with three of his friends, is observed as World Understanding and Peace Day. On this day, let us all together to specifically recognize and emphasize Rotary's dedication to international understanding, friendship, and peace.

In October 2014, the R I Board of Directors designated February as the area of focus: "Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention Month". This month I will discuss the Rotary Peace Centers program.

Rotary Peace Centers offer tailor-made curricula to train individuals devoted to peacebuilding and conflict resolution. The Rotary Peace Centers program was established in 1999, and the first peace centers began classes three years later. Since then, more than 1,500 peace fellows from 115 countries have graduated from Rotary Peace Centers. There are six Peace Centers worldwide, but the only one in Asia is located at International Christian University in Mitaka, Tokyo. The school's emphasis on intergovernmental peacekeeping organizations is underscored in classes such as "The United Nations and Sustainable Development" and "Multilateral Diplomacy." "ICU holds a mission to foster international citizens contributing to the establishment of lasting peace." says Professor Arakaki, the program's director, "And it has formed countless UN and international organization staff members and diplomats."

The 22-month peace studies program prides itself on the open dialogue between students and instructors. Classes at the graduate level are offered in English, and the student-to-faculty ratio of 18-to-1 enables ICU to realize its mission of small-group education. A field trip to Hiroshima enables students, including some who have come from war-torn countries, to hear the voices of survivors of the nuclear bomb and witness firsthand how Japan attempts to overcome genocide through reconciliation. "The horror of Hiroshima is not simply in the past," Arakaki says. "It is a real fear that the tragedy may be repeated in parts or even the whole of the globe in the future unless we make a concerted effort to avoid that situation." The professor is also a former Rotary Foundation Scholar with a deep knowledge of Rotary.

Conflicts have broken out all over the world, including Russia's invasion of Ukraine that began in February of the year before last and the conflict between Israel and Hamas. Now is the time to act as Rotary members with recognition of the importance of nurturing future peacebuilders. Through My Rotary, you can designate contributions to specific areas of activity within the Annual Fund. Designating your gift to "Peacebuilding and Conflict Prevention" is one important action you can take for peacebuilding.

This month, I continue with the Paul Harris quote.

"The way to war is a well-paved highway and the way to peace is still a wilderness."
